I must say, it is a long day, 6 AM until approximately 7:30 PM, and the commitment is for the entire day, no exceptions. You must take your lunch, snacks, etc., and will be expected to be on site the entire time. You will learn a tremendous amount of information about our election system and work with some fine citizens.

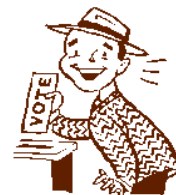
