NOTICE TO VENDORS:

The following revisions, additions, and clarifications are hereby made part of the Contract Documents for the above-referenced project and shall be taken into account in the preparation of all proposals and the execution of all work. Responders shall acknowledge receipt of these Questions and Answers in their proposals.

Q1. Can you provide a detailed retention policy with classifications for the body worn cameras? For example: Classification Traffic Stop is kept for 180 days.

Q2. Can you provide an estimated percentage of each classification type of video? For example Traffic Stop 90%, DUI 1%, etc.

A2. Not as of yet; we don't have enough experience with our new Mobile Digital Server system to provide accurate estimates.

Q3. Can you provide details on how you would like to upload this video? WiFi or 10 Bay Docking Stations?

A3. Both.

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- Q4. If you decide to use the 10 bay docking stations, will you provide a desktop computer for every 2 docking stations or do we need to quote that out in our proposal?
A4. Quote desktop computers complete with specs as optional, as stated in the scope of work.
- Q5. How many cameras will need to upload each day on average?
A5. Approximately 50.
- Q6. What is the maximum number of body cameras and in-car cameras that could possibly be uploading at one time per location?
A6. Approximately 50.
- Q7. Do you want the awarded vendor to provide training for 300 Officers and Administrators?
A7. Please quote that as an option.
- Q8. How many administrators need to be trained on operation of the body worn cameras?
A8. At this time, County is planning on five (5).
- Q9. If we provide training, how many officers can be available to train each day between 8am – 5pm?
A9. We will schedule officers to fit an 8-5 weekday training schedule.
- Q10. If we provide training, do we need to offer training after normal business hours?
A10. No.
- Q11. What is the connection speed of the network between each upload location and the server?
A11. The County has a series of Aruba A/C Wireless Access Points available for wireless video upload. At the Law Enforcement Center, the WAPs plug directly into a gigabit switch connected to our Mobile Digital Video Server. Currently 10MB data circuits exist between 2 of our other main upload sites, Southern Area Command and Northern Area Command; they also have Aruba WAPs at those sites.
- Q12. How will the Sheriff's Office fund the Body Worn Cameras?
A12. This information is not available to vendors at this time.
- Q13. Does the Sheriff's Office have a budget or estimated cost?
A13. This information is not available to vendors at this time.
